Their pick'n'mix approach means that even inadequate, illconsidered targets are being missed. Without a sufficient framework, they might as well be picking daisies whilst the world burns.

Yet again, COP26 will not hold leaders to account without a C&C framework—unless of course they can come up with something better (telling us what that means of course).
