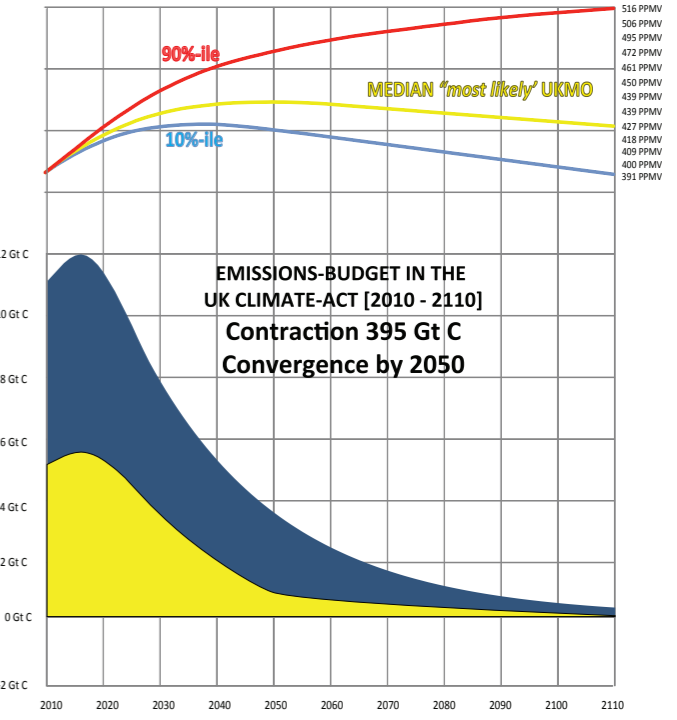
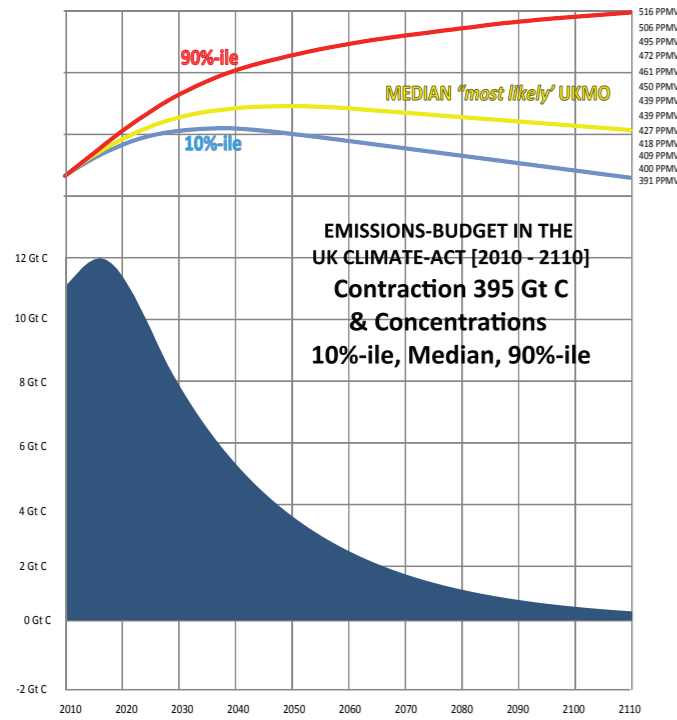

What the UK Climate Act said fronting 'C&C'

At COP-15 Copenhagen in 2009, the UK Government used C&C - as in the UK Climate Act - to argue that: -

- Due to 'negative feedback, 80% of the carbon budget would be reabsorbed by the sinks by 2110, and
- Convergence by 2050 offered Developing Countries an extra 2.5% of the available budget.
- This offer was a reward for agreeing to equal per capita budget-sharing globally by 2050,
- But by when 80% of the budget had been used up.

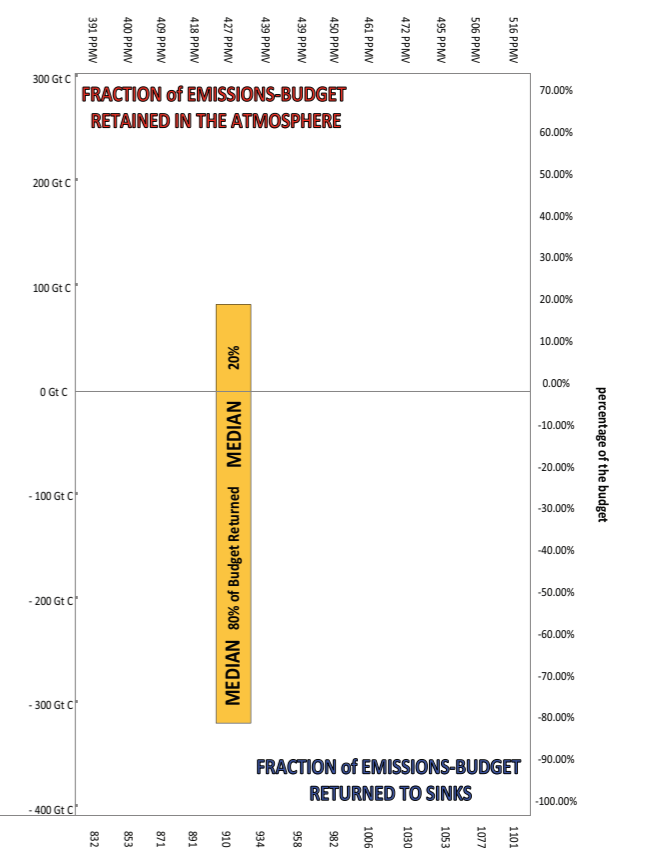
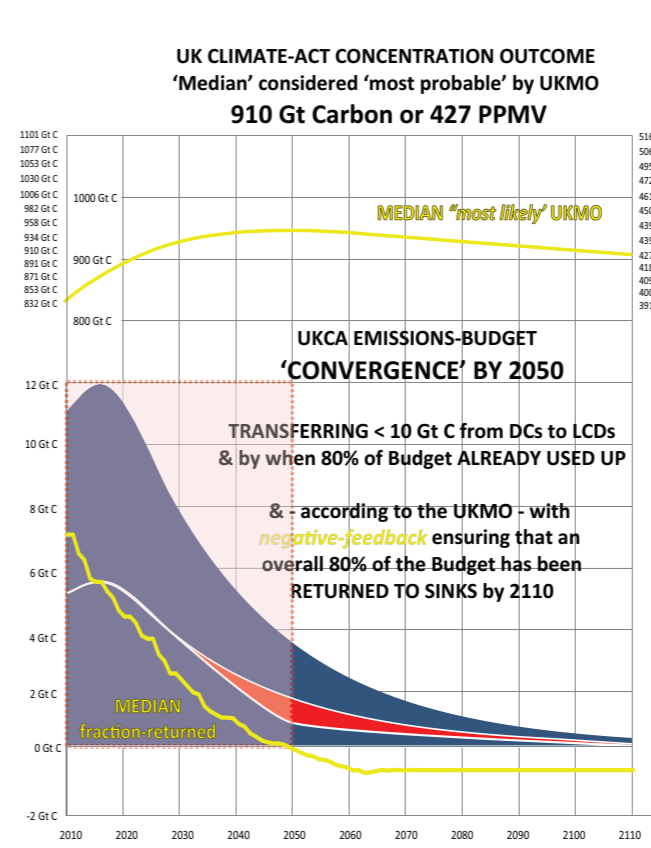
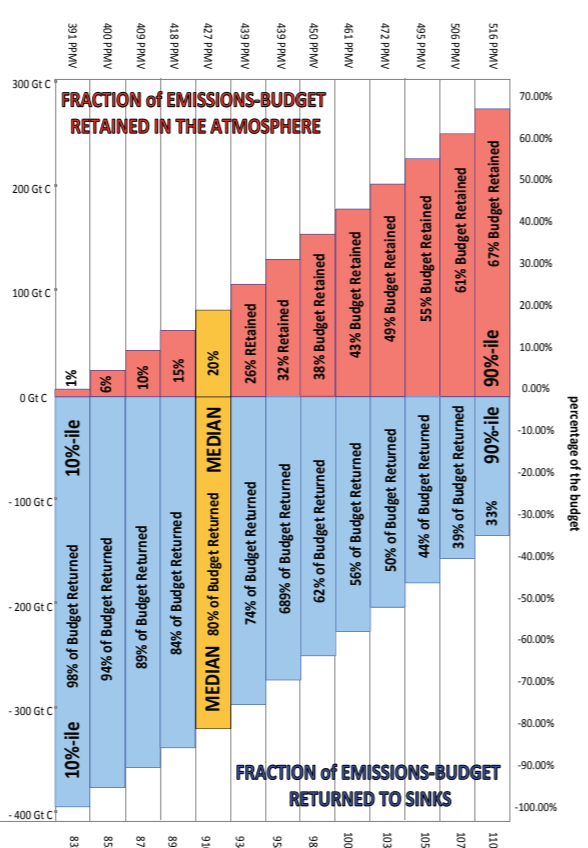
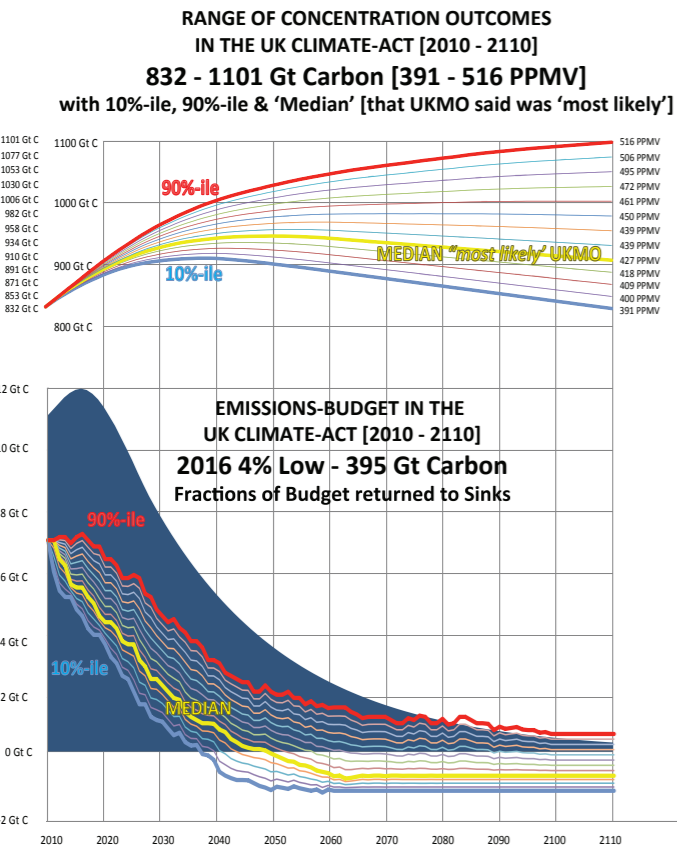
Unsurprisingly, Developing Countries rejected this 'deal' as 'Developed Countries trying to sieze the Lion's Share.
